2009 Class Descriptions and Rules

HALTER - Horses to be shown at a walk and trot, and will be asked to walk along the rail, with whips down. Horses should not be stretched. Conformation and breed characteristics are to be judged in the following order: conformation, type, quality, movement, substance, manners, and presence. A suitable headstall with throatlatch is mandatory. Excessive use of the whip or voice shall be penalized.

MOST CLASSIC - Not to be judged as a halter class. Horses to enter the ring at a trot and will be judged along the rail at the walk and trot. Judged on type, presence, animation, carriage, and conformation. Handlers must be 18 and over.

SHOWMANSHIP - Conformation of the horse is not to count. This class is judged on the exhibitor's ability to fit and show the horse. Basic 4-H rules shall apply.

LEADLINE - Open to riders ten years of age or under who are not eligible for other performance classes. Safety shall be a priority.

WALK/TROT - This class is broken down into two age divisions, youth (17 and under) and adult amateur (18 and over). Both equitation and pleasure classes are offered, with 90% of the score in pleasure based on the horse, and 90% of the score based on the rider in equitation. Any seat is allowed. Headers are allowed when the horses are lined up at the conclusion of the class.

GREEN HORSE - Open to horses of any age that are considered too "green" for more advanced classes. Any seat is allowed. Arabian or running martingales are allowed. Horse not be shown in any other performance class except the walk/trot pattern class.

JUNIOR HORSE - Open to horses 5 years of age or under, any seat. These horses are NOT prohibited from showing in other performance classes.

NOVICE HORSE - Open to horses which have not won THREE blue ribbons in a particular seat at any shows. Horses may be advanced in one division and novice in another.

SHOW HACK - A show hack horse is not necessarily a dressage horse NOR an English Pleasure horse. Notable transitions between gaits and between each change in gait are required. Hunt or dressage attire is acceptable. Bridles may be snaffles or dressage weymouths. The following gaits are required to be performed both ways of the ring: normal walk, collected walk, extended walk; normal trot, collected trot, extended trot; normal canter, collected canter, extended canter; hand gallop.

SADDLE SEAT - These classes are judged on basic 4-H rules. Patterns are strongly encouraged in championship classes. Horses may wear weymouth or pelham bridles. Snaffles are allowed only on junior horses. No day coats.

HUNT SEAT - These classes are judged on basic 4-H rules. Patterns are strongly encouraged in championship classes. Horses may wear snaffle, pelham, or weymouth bridles.

STOCK SEAT - These classes are judged on basic 4-H rules. Patterns are strongly encouraged in championship classes. Junior horses may wear a snaffle bit or a bosal.

BAREBACK EQUITATION - This class is judged on 4-H rules. Chaps are allowed. Any seat is acceptable.

BASIC PATTERN CLASSES - Divided into three divisions to encourage even our walk/trot, green, and novice horses to participate. Score sheets are patterned after equestrian team saddle seat patterns.

BITLESS BRIDLES shall be acceptable in any performance class.
